

CHAPLAIN (Major- Retired) MITCHEL A. TULLOSS



Chaplain (Major) Mitchel A. Tulloss was born in Chattanooga, Tennessee. He holds a Bachelor of Science Degree from Lee University, Cleveland, Tennessee and a Master of Divinity from the Church of God School of Theology, Cleveland, Tennessee. He is an ordained minister in the Church of God.

While attending seminary, Chaplain Tulloss served as Pastor of the Inman Street Church of God, Cleveland, Tennessee for three years.

Chaplain Tulloss enlisted in the U.S. Army in 1980 as a Material Control and Accounting Specialist. He was assigned to the 19th Engineer Battalion, Fort Knox, Kentucky in 1982-1983. He served in the Direct Support Battalion, Grafenwohr, Germany in 1983-1984. Chaplain Tulloss left active duty in 1984 and joined the U.S. Army Reserves. While in the U.S. Army Reserves, he served in the 3397th Garrison Unit, Chattanooga, Tennessee, from 1985-1994.

Chaplain Tulloss received a direct commission in the U.S. Army on 4 October 1994. He was accessioned back onto Active Duty on June 15, 1997 as a Battalion chaplain for 2nd Battalion, 39th Infantry Regiment, Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and served until June 2000. He served as Battalion chaplain for 4th Battalion, 27th Field Artillery, Baumholder, Germany from July 2000 to December 2003. During this time he deployed to Kosovo and Baghdad, Iraq. He served as the Resource Manager at the Installation Chaplain's Office at Fort McPherson, GA and as the Pastor of the Fort Gillem Chapel at Fort Gillem, GA. from 2004 to 2007. Chaplain Tulloss served as the 3rd Regiment Chaplain at the United States Military Academy, West Point, NY, from 2007-2009. During this time he also served as the pastor of the West Point Christian Fellowship. Chaplain Tulloss served as the Brigade Chaplain for the 4TH BCT/10TH Mountain Division, Fort Polk, Louisiana, from 2009 - 2012. During this time he deployed to Afghanistan from 2010 - 2011. He served as the Battalion Chaplain for 30th AG Battalion in Fort Benning, Georgia from July 2012 - October 2013. Chaplain Tulloss retired from the U.S. Army on 31 October 2013 with 33 years of faithful and honorable service.

Chaplain Tulloss has pastored and provided ministry to Soldiers in Germany, Kosovo, Iraq and Afghanistan. He served in two combat tours. After retiring from the military, Chaplain Tulloss has served as a Corrections Chaplain and currently serves as a Hospital Chaplain at Saint Thomas hospital, Nashville TN.
